Resolution 20-19 A Resolution to supplement appropriations and transfer funds within the Municipal Court computer fund of the city. Motion: Dane Allard moved, seconded by Mary Stanforth to approve and adopt. Vote all yeas. Approved and adopted. Auditor Alex Butler explained this was to allow Judge McKenna to purchase teleconference technology with Court computer fund monies.

Resolution 20-20 A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor and Safety and Service Director to enter into a joint partnership agreement with the Highland County Commissioners for program year 2020 Community Housing Impact & Preservation (CHIP) program to address local housing needs and to declare an emergency. Motion: Ann Morris moved, seconded by Patty Day to suspend the three-reading rule. Vote all yeas. Three reading suspended. Motion: Claudia Klein moved, seconded by Patty Day to adopt as an emergency. Vote al yeas. Approved and adopted as an emergency. Brianne Abbott, SSD explained this would allow the County and City to work together with Community Action in applying for funds on the city's behalf. See Exhibit A.

Resolution 20-21 A Resolution to authorize the Safety and Service Director to bid and accept the lowest and best bid for the Harry Sauner Strom Sewer and Sidewalk Improvement Project. Motion: Mary Stanforth moved, seconded by Ann Morris to approve and adopt. Vote all yeas. Approved and adopted. Mary Stanforth asked if sidewalks would be a continuation rom Kiblers Lumber. Brianne Abbott explained it would be from property line to property line of Walmart from her understanding.

Resolution 20-22 A Resolution authorizing the Safety and Service Director of the city of Hillsboro to prepare and submit an application for the FY2020 recycling and litter management grant program. Motion: Claudia Klein moved, seconded by Brandon Leeth to approve and adopt. Vote all yeas. Approved and adopted. Brianne Abbott SSD explained this grant application request will help with recycling citywide cleanup program in the amount of \$5,000.00. The city will match the \$500.00.

Resolution 20-23 A Resolution to authorize the Safety and Service Director to enter into a contract with Stantec Consulting Service, Inc. for the design and engineering for Phase II Storm Sewer Improvements in an amount not to exceed \$72,000 and declaring an emergency. Motion: Brandon Leeth moved, seconded by Mary Stanforth to suspend the three-reading rule. Vote all yeas. Motion: Adam Wilkin moved, seconded by Brandon Leeth to approve and adopt as an emergency. Vote all yeas. Three-reading rule suspended and approved and adopted as an emergency. Brianne Abbott, SSD explained this is Phase II of III Storm Sewer Project on West Pleasant, South High to Vine Street extension of Phase I, once this is completed it will go onto Phase III.

Resolution 20-24 A Resolution authorizing the Safety and Service Director of the city of Hillsboro to prepare and submit an application for the FY2020 Community Development Critical Infrastructure grant program (CI). Motion: Claudia Klein moved, seconded by Ann Morris to approve and adopt. Vote all yeas. Approved and adopted. Brianne Abbott explained this is a \$500,000.00 grant for Springlake Street - street widening of sidewalk, curb, gutter storm sewer project. This resolution and Resolution 20-25 and 20-26 are part of the revitalization program on Johnson Street.

Resolution 20-25 A Resolution authorizing the Safety and Service Director of the city of Hillsboro to prepare and submit an application for the FY2020 Community Development Neighborhood Revitalization grant program (NRG) Motion: Ann Morris moved, seconded by Patty Day to approve and adopt. Vote all yeas. Approved and adopted. Brianne Abbott explained this was for Johnson Street revitalization project, street improvements, sidewalk, curb& gutter, storm & sanitary improvements and a possible blighted demolition of blighted property. This is a \$250,000.00 grant that will include the revitalization of 3 buildings in the downtown historic district.

Resolution 20-26 A Resolution authorizing the Safety and Service Director of the city of Hillsboro to prepare and submit an application for the FY2020 Community Development Program Formula Allocation Fund Program. Motion: Brandon Leeth moved, seconded by Mary Stanforth to approve and adopt. Vote all yeas. Approved and adopted. Same as three prior resolutions.

Resolution 20-27 A Resolution authorizing the Safety and Service Director of the city of Hillsboro to prepare and submit an application for the FY2020 Community Development Program Residential Public Infrastructure Grant (RPIG). Motion: Brandon Leeth moved, seconded by Claudia Klein to approve and adopt. Vote all yeas. Approved and adopted. Resolution 20-28 A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor to submit an application for funds under the Downtown Revitalization Program to the Ohio Development Service Agency, Office of Community Development and to enter into all

contracts associated with the application and funded grant application. Motion: Claudia Klein moved, seconded by Patty Day to approve and adopt. Vote all yeas. Approve and adopted. Mayor Justin Harsha explained this will target structural issues up to \$250,000.00, a great opportunity for Hillsboro Downtown.

Resolution 20-29 A resolution for the transfer of various funds for Fiscal Year 2020. Motion: Brandon Leeth moved, seconded by Claudia Klein to approve and adopt. Vote all yeas. Approved and adopted. Auditor Alex Butler explained this is a standard resolution as different times money needs moved. A blanket resolution such as this can take care of the years moving of money. This gives the Auditor the authority to move these funds.

HILLSBORO PLANNING COMMISSION

CALL TO ORDER

At 5:30 p.m., Rob Holt Chair, called the Hillsboro Planning Commission meeting to order.

ROLL CALL

The following were present for the meeting: Rob Holt; Chair, Mayor Justin Harsha, Brianne Abbott; Safety Service Director, Paul Worley, Charlie Guarino and Tracy Aranyos. Also present were Clerk Kimberly Newman, Council President Tom Eichinger, and Ann Morris; Council member.

DETERMINATION OF QUORUM

A quorum was met.

APPROVE MINUTES

The minutes from Planning Commission meeting held on Mach 23, 2020 were reviewed and accepted as presented.

MOMENT OF SILENCE TO HONOR JOE MAHAN: Chair Rob Holt requested a moment of silence for Joe Mahan, words of gratitude and honor were spoken on behalf of Joe and his service on Planning Commission and his time and service to the city of Hillsboro. Joe had served as a board member on Planning Commission since 2016. Mayor Harsha had spoke to the Mahan family at Joe's funeral and plans were in place to dedicate a bench with Joe's name on it to be placed in the downtown business area. Charlie Guarino also expressed his thought on gaining donations to plant a tree in the downtown area in Joe's honor.

CORRESPONDENCE – Email from Greg VanZant on annexation to Brianne Abbott. Revised site plan for Marriott hotel.

DISCUSSION: Annexation-SSD Brianne Abbott discussed the email from Greg VanZant in regard to annexation. Attorney Greg VanZant advised Ms. Abbott that it falls to the duty of property owner to obtain legal services in annexation and to complete and submit necessary paperwork required in annexation. It was his legal opinion that the Planning Commission should help at all extent possible to those seeking annexation, but not to the extent of doing the paperwork and accruing the costs of annexation process. Ms. Abbott advised that she forwarded this information on to Randy Butler, realtor of Fenner property, to date has not heard back from Mr. Butler on this issue of Fenner property acquiring annexation to the city of Hillsboro. Chair Rob Holt and Charlie Guarino

inquired if Lind Media had recently had communication with the city or Clerk of Planning Commission on whether or not Lind Media was pursuing the purchase of Fenner property for the purpose of annexation at their billboard location. There has been no contact with Lind media since the first of the year 2020.

Revised Site Plan Marriott hotel- SSD Brianne Abbott advised the Planning Commission that the city had a conference call with the Patels and the retail plaza had been decreased in square footage and parking spaces were still compliant even with the reduction of square footage. There were changes made on south end parking due to natural water way, that portion of the parking spaces were cut. The previous dates anticipated for ground breaking, financing, and hotel build will be pushed back due to COVID19. Charlie Guarino gave an update on Land Bank. The Land Bank is going strong, with work going on at Rocky Fork area. There have been some issues with Federal funding, but Highland County delinquent taxes generates some funds for the Land Bank. Mr. Guarino urged Planning Commission and the city if they had any addresses to share for Land Bank opportunities, to give them to him to share with Land Bank.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS -Imagine Hillsboro- Master Plan. Amended Zoning Code.

DISCUSSION- There was no public comment at February 24, 2020 meeting. Imagine Hillsboro resolution will be presented at April Council meeting. Amended Zoning Code legislation will be presented for second reading at April Council Meeting.

NEW BUSINESS - Joe Mahan's position on Planning Commission Board

-Annexation of Fenner Property. SSD Brianne Abbott had spoken with Randy Butler in reference of Fenner property being annexed. The owner of Fenner property does not wish to circulate a petition or pay any fees accrued to achieve annexation of said properties, but would like the property annexed.

DISCUSSION- Chair Rob Holt advised that this had been discussed last year when Lind Media Billboard was being reviewed. Chair, Rob Holt stated that attorney Greg VanZant was in the process of looking into the annexation process to explore the possibility of deferring taxes until the property is sold. Law Director Fred Beery was to reach out and discuss this with Annika Collins as well. Fred Beery has not reported back to the Planning Commission on this topic. SSD Brianne Abbott advised the Planning Commission that she would contact Greg VanZant and get his progress on the Annexation of Fenner property.
