FENCES

§ 155.074 A.1.F

A fence is considered an accessory structure. Fencing is allowed up to 7 feet tall and to be located in any side or rear yard. Fencing located in the front yard or corner lots where the yard(s) are facing the street(s), are restricted to the height of 4 feet tall and must be of ornamental design. There is no minimum setback from the property line for fencing. If you need your property lines marked, you will need to contact a surveyor. Fencing is prohibited in the city's right of way.

§155.074 A.1.G

No person, firm, or corporation shall erect any structure or fence upon any premises so as to obstruct the visibility of the operator of any motor vehicle backing from any drive or public way. No person, firm, or corporation shall erect a fence or other structure limiting access to property unless a permit has been issued by the Safety and Service Director certifying that no hazard to public safety will result from such construction. There shall be no charge for such permit and denial of a permit shall be in writing setting for specifically the hazard to public safety. The Director may establish rules for administration of this section and standards for automatic approval of applications for permits

Section 303

303.2 Enclosures

Private swimming pools, hot tubs and spas, containing water more than 24 inches (610 mm) in depth shall be completely surrounded by a fence or barrier not less than 48 inches (1219 mm) in height above the finished ground level measured on the side of the barrier away from the pool.

Gates and doors in such barriers shall be self¬closing and self-latching. Where the selflatching device is less than 54 inches (1372 mm) above the bottom of the gate, the release mechanism shall be located on the pool side of the gate. Self-closing and self-latching gates shall be maintained such that the gate will positively close and latch when released from an open position of6 inches (152 mm) from the gatepost. An existing pool enclosure shall not be removed, replaced or changed in a manner that reduces its effectiveness as a safety barrier.

Exception: Spas or hot tubs with a safety cover that com¬plies with ASTM Fl346 shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.
