# REPORT OF THE SAFETY & SERVICE DIRECTOR/HILLSBORO PLANNING COMMISSION

Brianne Abbott shared,

"Thank you, Mr. President. Good evening, City Council.

For the month of November, there were 3 commercial and 6 residential building permits. The Roberts Lane extension project is nearing completion, with the intersection widening and electrical work finishing up. The city is working with the design firm on the Crossroads Park, Appalachian Community Grant Project. Preliminary Plans are being completed for the rails to trails project. The Beech and Railroad St, road construction is underway. The contractor will be off site for the holiday but will resume a few weeks into the new year. The roads will be open during the break in work. This year's

Christmas Tree Lighting and Parade were successful and well attended. The Planning Commission approved three commercial site plans, a conditional use permit and a temporary use permit at their November and December meetings.

Lastly, the city in collaboration with the Highland County Health Department will present the National Fitness Campaign to city council at its February meeting. There has been some literature shared with council in regards to this initiative and I would like to request that the same be placed into the appropriate committee for review prior to presentation. Resolution 24-36 A Resolution to allow the Mayor, Safety and Service Director, and Economic Development Coordinator to execute documents for the Appalachian Community Grant on behalf of the City of Hillsboro

DISCUSSION: SSD Brianne Abbott stated this legislation will allow the city to execute documents associated with the ACGP – Crossroads Park project. Suspension of the three-reading rule is requested to allow the city to execute those documents in a timely manner. Mr. Eichinger asked if this covers the whole project. Ms. Abbott responded yes, grant agreement, CMR agreement, contractor agreements, everything that is necessary to follow through with the grant.

Ordinance 2024-61 An Ordinance authorizing the lease of real estate owned by the City of Hillsboro

DISCUSSION: SSD Brianne Abbott stated that this legislation will allow the city to put out for bid the lease of tillable ground at Liberty Park. The legislation will also allow for the city to accept the highest bidder. The contract for the lease is for three years. Suspension of the three-reading rule is requested to allow the city the necessary amount of time to solicit bids and enter in contract prior to the 2025 farming season. Ms. Stanforth asked how many acres. SSD Brianne Abbott thought it was roughly 69 acres but didn't have that information in front of her. Ms. Stanforth confirmed the location and SSD Brianne Abbott stated it is being farmed now with a contract in place, but the lease is up.

Resolution 24-37 A Resolution approving the tentative collective bargaining agreement between the City of Hillsboro, State of Ohio, and the Fraternal Order of Police, Ohio Labor Council, INC., representing dispatchers, patrol officers, and sergeants in the City of Hillsboro Police Department SERB case #2024-MED-07-0738 (patrol officers); #2024-MED-07-0739 (dispatchers); and #2024-MED-07-0740 (sergeants) and declaring an emergency

DISCUSSION: SSD Brianne Abbott stated this legislation will allow the city to enter into the collective bargaining agreement with the Fraternal Order of Police effective through December 31, 2027. Suspension of the three-reading rule and passage by emergency is requested to immediately enter into the agreement that will be effective January 1, 2025. MOTION: Mr. Wilkin moved to suspend the three-reading rule, seconded by Mr. Maurer. Vote: Mr. Baucher-yes, Mr. Wilkin-yes, Mr. Storer-yes, Mr. Brown-yes, Ms. Hapner-yes, Mr. Maurer-yes, Ms. Stanforth-yes. Resolution 24-37 three-reading rule suspended. MOTION: Mr. Maurer moved to approve and adopt Resolution 24-37, seconded by Mr. Wilkin. Ordinance 2024-62 An Ordinance to make appropriations for current expenses and other expenditures of the City of Hillsboro, State of Ohio, during the fiscal year ending December 31, 2025

DISCUSSION: City Auditor Dawson Barreras stated this legislation was for the 2025 budget. Mr. Barreras explained the process of coming up with the budget, and stated he felt the city was in a very good spot for 2025. There is a 1.2 million-dollar carryover. Ms. Stanforth asked if there were any changes from the budget presented to the finance committee. Mr. Barreras stated there were changes, but very minimal and mostly due to health insurance. Mr. Barreras also mentioned there was approximately 2 million less in asks this year.

Resolution 24-38 A Resolution for the transfer of various funds for fiscal year 2025 DISCUSSION: Mr. Barreras stated this legislation is passed every year with the budget to allow him to move funds from the general fund to other funds that may be lacking, without having to come to council each time. Mr. Eichinger stated again that these funds are from the general fund.

MOTION: Mr. Maurer moved to suspend the three-reading rule for Resolution 24-38, seconded by Mr. Storer. Vote: Mr. Storer-yes, Mr. Wilkin-yes, Ms. Hapner-yes, Mr. Maurer-yes, Ms. Stanforth-yes, Mr. Baucher-yes, Mr. Brown-yes. Resolution 24-38 three-reading rule suspended.
